

Lynn McDonald is professor emerita at the University of Guelph, Canada.

She did her PhD at the London School of Economics, has an honorary doctorate from York University (Toronto) and is a member of the Order of Canada. Her 16-volume, peer-reviewed *Collected Works of Florence Nightingale* came out 2001-12. Since then, she has published four short books on Nightingale (among 28 books) and is a co-founder of the Nightingale Society.

McDonald is a former member of Canada's Parliament. Her private member's bill, the Non-smokers' Health Act, 1988, was the first legislation in the world to establish smoke-free work and public spaces.
